Knoxville Tree Benefits - Tree Keeper Information from City website

- Environmental benefits \$1,807,425.44 annually
- Greenhouse Gas Benefits \$42,587.94 CO₂ avoided & sequestered
- Reducing Stormwater runoff & maintenance cost \$ 450,469.89 45+
 million gallons saved



2023 Urban Forest Master Plan

- Trees Knoxville raises funds, and put out Requests for Proposals In July 2022
 - a. Funding from City, State, KUB, KKB, UT and Local Organizations
 - b. Still bringing partners together
- Selection Committee formed and selected a Consultant in October 2022 (City, Trees Knoxville, KUB, City Tree Board, Knoxville Knox County Planning) from 7 different proposals.
- Project Kick-off December 2022



Priority areas to be covered in the Urban Forest Master Plan

This list was developed to gain information for City of Knoxville and Trees Knoxville to inform future management

- Assess urban forest conditions and threats. Rank the threat and how to address the threats.
- Determine technologies to manage the UTC.
- Evaluate existing relationships with infrastructure and trees and recommend improvements.
- Analyze city urban forest codes and recommend improvements.
- Assess the city's urban forestry program and make recommendations to improve it.
- Evaluate work on private property, and recommend ways to manage trees on private property.
- Execute a robust public involvement process. Review the Tree Board structure and provide any recommendations on their roles and duties.



Priority areas to be covered in the Urban Forest Master Plan

This list was developed to gain information for City of Knoxville and Trees Knoxville to inform future management

- Define metrics to measure success and keep the plan updated.
- Recommend "Priority Planting Locations".
- Recommended "Urban Tree Canopy Goals".
- Strategize actionable funding mechanisms to implement the UFMP.
- Develop outreach and education strategies and provide guidance to implement them.
- Deliver approaches for public & private partners to collaborate on urban forestry efforts.
- Provide guidance on how Knox County may build an Urban Forestry program.



Knoxville Plan

City Focused

Over 24,000 acres of tree canopy in City of Knoxville (36%)

Over 14,000 acres on private residential land (2/3 of all canopy)

Approximately 75% on privately owned land citywide.
